



Mini Jam Jar Tree

Stampin' Up! Supplies Used:

- · Stamps: none
- · Inks: none
- Cardstock: Mossy Meadow (133676), Old Olive (100702), Crumb Cake (120953), Early Espresso (119686) and Real Red (102482)
- · Designer Paper: none
- Accessories: Real Red Mini Ruffled Ribbon (156323) and Mini Jam Jars (155685)
- Tools: Christmas Pinecone dies (156309), Christmas Trimmings dies (155561), Stampin' Cut 'n Emboss (f-150673 m-149653), and Take Your Pick tool (144107)
- · Miscellaneous: Glue Dots (103683) and Multipurpose glue (110755)

INSTRUCTIONS:



You will need one pack of Mini Jam Jars to complete your tree.

I want to be able to change this so I used glue dots. I also did not want to melt the jars.



You will want to "build" from the bottom up. Three for the bottom. Using just one glue dot.

Do not add to the lid. You want to open them.



Note: how they nestle together very easily. Adding only one dot per connection.

To help stabilize this; here is where you will add your ribbon.

Gently lift up the bottom and add your Real Red Ruffled ribbon. Tying a bow to help it look pretty.



Now that your tree is tied up. Using a 5 % x 8 % piece of each Old Olive and Mossy Meadow cardstock. Cut out a full set of each color.

Using both of the large dies from Christmas Pinecone.



Use multipurpose glue to adhere. You will get two full sets out of those two cuts.

Using an Old Olive "top" added to a Mossy Meadow "bottom". And vice versa on the second. You will want to keep in mind that you will be cutting these up. Add glue to each "section" of pinecones.



Here is the first section to cut.



Here is how it should look when you have both cut up.
This works out to be able to put one section in each Mini Jam Jar.
Using 6 led candles (dollar tree) and a glue dot to connect to the candle.
Each section will fit snugly into each Mini Jam Jar.

NOTE: here is why you do not want to secure the jars at the lids. You want to be able to turn the lights on and off.



Creating the star.

Using 3 % x 3 % of each Real Red and Crumb Cake cardstock. Early Espresso is % x 3 %. Score this long across the top at % - 1 % - 2 % Using the large background star and the outline from Christmas Trimming dies.



Tuck the ½ score section under the ribbon.



Using the Multipurpose Glue to adhere like the above.



Adding your die cut star to that triangle so that it stand up.
